Making knitted toys

Back in 2017 a needle was found in a soft toy that had been made by a member and been sent out by the Mothers' Union. Following this, MSH asked members to follow strict procedures when making toys to give to children including rigorous testing and adding a CE label. This has not worked well, so Mothers' Union have issued updated guidance for groups who wish to make craft items:

Best practice is for the branch/diocesan/community craft group to meet up and for everyone to check the items. Since different people all have different priorities, the items should be thoroughly checked by the end of going round the group. Any items going out should be checked; twiddle muffs, teddies, stars, nativity characters, squares - we don't want any going out with a choking hazard for example. Once checked a luggage type of tag with a Mothers' Union label can be attached, and the suggested wording is 'This item was made with love, with new wool and stuffing. It is not made to Toy Safety Standards but has been checked prior to being given this tag'. If you wish you can add 'with love from your branch/diocese/group' on the label to make it more personal.

Please can you record how many items your group has made and let me know, so that I can include that in the figures I input to MU Live.
