Gender-based violence in South Sudan

On 27th March 2025 the Anglican Communion raised South Sudan's plight at the 58th Session of the Human Rights Council of the United Nations in Geneva, raising the human rights of women in the country;

An extract from the statement.....

The Vienna Declaration remains a major achievement for human rights, recognising the

dignity of each person, which we believe reflects the image of God in them, but rights mean little when the world allows atrocities against women and girls to continue.

As an example, 14 years ago, the world welcomed the birth of South Sudan, yet today women and girls continue to be abducted, raped along ethnic lines, subjected to sexual exploitation by captives, and gang raped.
